### American pioneer in international basketball (FIBA)

- Coached with 5 different national teams–teams won 2 gold, 1 silver and 3 bronze medals. (Puerto Rico, Canada, USA, China, Dominican Republic)
- Two World Championships, (Canada 1994 and USA 1998)
- 2004 Olympics in Athens, Head Coach of National Team of China. Finished in top 8, defeated defending World Champion, Serbia, to get into the medal round.
